Due to increased demand for our Therapy and Specialist Support services we are seeking experienced and skilled therapists to join our team to support ad-hoc projects and interventions. In this Bank position the post-holder may undertake a range of varied activities, including direct intervention with individual and groups of young people, primarily in SEN or mainstream settings; one-off assessments and reports; coaching, training and mentoring for professionals, front-line staff and families.



The post-holder will join our multidisciplinary Clinical Service team comprising Speech & Language Therapists; Occupational Therapists; Specialist Teachers; PBS practitioners; Applied Psychology and Sleep Specialists. You will work collaboratively with colleagues, families and external professionals to meet the needs of the young people we support.

NATURE OF THE POST

The post-holder will have experience of working in a range of settings and with young people with a range of SEN and complex needs. The postholder will have experience of planning and delivering therapy services based on the Balanced System - Universal, Targeted and Specialist model. The post-holder will work flexibly and in line with the Service Level Agreements with schools and Local Authority as required.

The post-holder will be skilled at forming and managing relationships with colleagues, other professionals, young people and family members. They will be able to work autonomously and as part of a multidisciplinary team.

As required, the post holder will deliver targeted interventions to groups and individual pupils, with training and coaching for staff as required. They will provide assessment, intervention and monitoring of speech, language and communication skills for the school cohort and provide written reports and guidance to support Annual Reviews and EHCP recommendations.

In respect of the general responsibilities as an employee of the Together Trust, the post-holder will be required to:

- Promote a positive image of the service and the Trust at all times.
- Be aware of and follow the relevant policies and procedures.
- Maintain confidentiality for all areas of the post.
- Take responsibility for the promotion of safeguarding and the welfare of children and young people for whom she/he is responsible.

As a Bank Occupational Therapist your responsibilities will be defined at the start of each piece of work or project and could include some of the following:

- Manage a clinical caseload of students, working in collaboration with teachers, class teams and the wider MDT.
- Support students' development, skills of daily living and independence skills across the school and learning environment; delivering indirect and direct interventions individually or in small groups.
- Ensure that sensory needs are identified and supported.
- Assess, monitor and record students' progress with respect to their development in all areas of occupation.
- Liaise with parents, families and carers, and advise on issues relating to the development.
- Contribute to the planning and delivery of training to colleagues across the whole school as required.
- Assist in the process of monitoring, evaluating and recording pupil's progress.
- Provide assessment reports and intervention plans for individual pupils.
- Maintain clinical records in line with school policy and HCPC guidelines.
- Contribute to individual risk assessments and pupil support plans.
- Complete such forms and paperwork as may be required by Trust and Clinical Service policies and procedures.
- Ensure clinical practice is up to date and based on agreed best clinical practice and evidence base. Participate in relevant education/training opportunities, read and critically appraise research articles in professional journals and utilise audit and research in daily practice.



- Establish/maintain internal and external networks in order to maintain good standards of practice, embrace new profession and clinical initiatives for the service and enhance job satisfaction.
- Maintain personal CPD portfolio in order to meet RCSLT & HCPC registration requirements.
- Undertake relevant Together Trust mandatory training and to ensure that training is refreshed at the required intervals.
